A summary of the British Heart Foundation's Blood Pressure Funded Programme – emerging themes and early learnings



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Background

- Awarded £1.5 million of funding to 15 sites across the UK (eg, local councils, CCGs)
- The programme consists of two rounds.
 - Round One commenced April 2017
 - Round Two commenced April 2019
- Aims
 - Improve access to community BP testing by piloting innovative models
 - Perform 10,000 new blood pressure checks over 2 year funding period
- Pre-requisite for funding:
 - Population of at least 100,000 people
 - Demonstrate evidence of unmet need locally
 - Blood pressure identified as local priority
 - Pathways in place to access behavioural and medical support

Early learnings and emerging themes

- Variation in uptake of BP checks in community pharmacies
- Data transfer into general practice
- Retrieval of outcome data from GP systems
- Lower uptake in community settings in general but especially within community pharmacy
- Lack of training competency framework for non-clinical staff performing BP checks
- Uptake for HBPM/ABPM not as successful as initially thought
